



What is the Aggie Creative Collective?

The Aggie Creative Collective is a five-week summer experience that allows you to work on the beginnings of your dream creative project and eventually develop it into its fulllength form. By the end of the summer, your project might become a submission for a:

- Creative publication
- Capstone Program
- Creative thesis in LAUNCH's Undergraduate Research Program

Improve your resume with this research-intensive creative experience! Market yourself to employers as a multi-skilled, collaborative, writing-proficient graduate with the ability to meet deadlines and finish a long-term project. Creative scholars can leverage this experience for work in higher education, publishing, and communications, as well as in traditional creative endeavors.

This program is open to all undergraduate majors!

All students will receive scholarship assistance via a guaranteed stipend. In the program, students will:

- conduct research like a creative writer and artist
- develop their work with creative writing and visualization faculty
- learn performance skills for public reading/ presentation
- develop a plan to move their creative project forward

Any eligible undergraduate with at least 30 hours can apply. Those with 60 credit hours can apply without a letter of support from faculty.
